Closet bank: How it works?

- 1. Only Anpa member families will be able to use the closet bank.
- 2. Only school uniform clothing is accepted, as well as aprons.
- 3. Clothing must be washed and in good condition.
- 4. For each item of clothing you donate, you will be entitled to another one at no cost, as long as it is available in the closet bank.
- 5. We will keep a record of the amount of clothing each family donates, so you don't have to store clothes at home. In the next edition, the number of garments you donated and for which you did not receive another in exchange will be taken into account.
- 6. In the event that you do not have clothes to donate or do not have previous donations, you will have to contribute €3 for each item of clothing you receive.
- 7. The assignment of garments is carried out by trying to assign a garment to each applicant in the first order review, the same with the second, and so on, giving preference to families who applied and did not receive garments in the previous edition.
- 8. The order for the clothes you need is made through TokApp, following the call from Fondo Armario (closet bank).
- 9. There are two calls throughout the course, one in December (before the Christmas holidays) and another in June (at the end of the course).
